Moving meant we had to give up jobs we loved, living near friends and family, and our new home. Because of the housing market at the time we couldn't immediately sell our house, so we had to pay the mortgage on a house nobody lived in with paychecks we no longer had. Needless to say, moving was scary. I remember packing our U-Haul and thinking about all we were giving up.

We had:

- No paycheck, no health insurance
- No place to live in Denver since we'd be using our savings just to pay the mortgage on the house we were walking away from. We couldn't even afford an apartment; we literally had no place to move into.
- No family nearby
- No Red Rocks Church services had actually happened yet

We were moving into nothing and felt like we were leaving behind everything. We were scared. We were excited. We needed God to do so many miracles! I wrote our needs down and started praying big, bold prayers. I watched as God answered prayers over and over again. I have witnessed the power of dreaming big dreams and inviting God into them. Without God we can do nothing, but with Him ALL things are possible (Matthew 19:26). He's still in the miracleworking business today!

With your journal I encourage you to embark on a NEW journey with our entire church family. Let's dream big dreams! Let's pray BIG prayers! Let's go together one more time to the all-powerful, all-knowing, all-capable God of the universe with our hopes, dreams, and audacious prayers, and begin believing together for God to do things in and through our lives that only HE can do. Our God is a God of miracles. I can't wait to hear how God meets us this year, and how He does immeasurably more than we can ask or imagine.
